Description

Dental assistants are critical healthcare professionals and the demand for more continues to rise. This bootcamp will help you understand the roles of a dental assistant through a look at the knowledge, essential skills, interpersonal communication and abilities needed to be successful in the industry. Learn about MCC Penn Valley-HSI course offerings that can help you achieve your career goal as a dental assistant through a series of hands-on activities.

Objectives

- have developed a better understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a dental assistant.
- have explored and gained basic knowledge and skills necessary for working as a dental assistant.
- have explored skills and techniques utilized in the dental assisting field.
- have reviewed educational opportunities available for licensure.

- 3. Explore a variety of tasks routinely performed by dental assistants such as: Infection Control/Personal Protective Equipment; X-rays on a mannikin; instruments; sealants; blood pressure; Mixing dental cements, 4-handed dentistry; polishing; and impressions

Overview of activities during the day

- Learn the differences between the professions of Dental Assisting and Dental Hygiene
- Discover what it takes to be successful in school and the profession after graduation
- Speak with current and former students about the program
- Rotate through stations with hands-on activities experiencing various topics
 - Infection control
 - Vital signs (blood pressure)
 - X-rays
 - Coronal Polishing
 - Mixing Dental cements
 - Impressions
 - Sealants
 - Instrumentation on a manikin

Participation Requirement

Attendees must be at least 18 years old. The course has been designed for 15 participants, and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis.
