General Education Requirements	<p>Students who hold an Associate of Arts Degree from MCC or have met the Missouri 42-hour General Education Core requirements are considered to have fulfilled all UCM General Education requirements, except:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Personal Interaction: This requirement may be fulfilled by appropriate transfer courses.</li> <li>▪ Integrative Studies: This requirement is fulfilled by IGEN 3116 in Division IV of UCM's General Education program and must be taken at UCM.</li> <li>▪ Any major required general education course not previously taken.</li> </ul> <p>For those students with an Associate Degree other than the Associate of Arts or who have not completed the A.A., transfer courses are evaluated on a course-by-course basis.</p>
Credits Required for B.S.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Minimum of 120 hours</li> <li>▪ Minimum of 30 hours of upper-level credit (3000/4000 level)<sup>^</sup></li> <li>▪ Minimum of 12 upper-level hours (3000/4000) in major<sup>^</sup></li> </ul> <p><sup>^</sup>Courses taken at a two-year college MAY be articulated for an upper-level course by WILL NOT count towards upper-level hour requirements.</p>
Minor Required	Yes; Students are required to earn a minor in either Marketing or Business Administration.

GPA Required for Graduation	Students must achieve a minimum GPA of 2.00 in all grade point averages to qualify for graduation. This includes cumulative GPA, UCM GPA, major GPA, and minor GPA (if applicable). Some degree programs have additional GPA requirements.
Residency Requirements to Receive a Degree from UCM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 30 hours must be completed at UCM</li> <li>▪ 20 upper-level hours must be completed at UCM</li> <li>▪ 15 hours, 9 hours of which must be upper-level, in major must be from UCM</li> <li>▪ ***9 hours, 1 hour of which must be upper-level, in minor must be from UCM</li> <li>▪ The last 12 semester hours must be earned at UCM</li> </ul>
General Education Assessment (GEA)	All UCM students are required to pass a General Education Assessment (GEA) test. Students transferring in more than 45 hours are required to take the test during their first semester at UCM.
