MCC FIRST-YEAR EXPERIENCE

The First-Year Experience (FYE) is a program designed to help you prepare for the transition into college and promote success during your first year. Your first-year experiences may differ from each other, but all students will achieve the following outcomes:

1. COLLEGE RESOURCES

Demonstrate an ability to navigate the academic structure and requirements, utilization of appropriate campus resources and participation in comprehensive co-curricular engagement activities.

2. ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Demonstrate skills and strategies to enhance academic success and an appreciation for intellectual inquiry.

3. ACADEMIC AND CAREER EXPLORATION

Demonstrate an understanding of the relationship of one's education to their personal and professional development.

4. DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION AWARENESS

Exhibit inclusive behaviors and attitudes and demonstrate shared responsibility for the growth and well-being of campus community. Engage in and contribute to campus life by participating in intercultural programming.

5. PERSONAL GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

Demonstrate independence and self-efficacy by building meaningful relationships with others, including peers, staff and faculty.

TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

ACADEMIC ADVISORS

Assist students in selecting courses and meeting program requirements.

COUNSELORS

Help students gain a better understanding of their career path, personal potential and well-being.

CAREER SERVICES

Assist students in developing a resume, networking and finding internships and/or jobs.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

Prepare students for specific occupations. Options may include an Associate in Applied Science degree, a certificate, or individual courses to build job-related skills.

TRANSFER DEGREE PROGRAMS

Required and elective courses that prepare students to continue their studies at a four-year college or university.

LEARNING/TUTORING CENTERS

Offer services such as tutoring and basic skills instruction in areas such as language, math and reading.

MILESTONE

An important accomplishment or action used to measure progress toward a goal, such as successful completion of the first year (30 credits) as an MCC student.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

A series of required and elective courses that lead to a degree or certificate, often referred to as a "major."

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Any educational event that has learning outcomes occurring outside of the classroom.
