Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S) Graphic Design-Part-Time Advising Guide

This program leads to the Associate of Applied Science degree and prepares students for jobs as graphic designers or transfer to four-year degree programs. The curriculum supports a variety of visual communication topics like typography, color theory, printmaking, package design, branding, layout design, and web design, so that students can build competency in a range of design techniques.

Students must successfully complete *GDES 110-Digital Design Applications* and GDES 115 – Introduction to Graphic Arts to enter the Graphic Design program and to enroll in any subsequent GDES courses.

**NOTE: Several GDES courses are offered on the Penn Valley Campus only.
