Middle School Education Emphasis

Part-Time Advising Guide

With Missouri state certification in Middle School Education you will be qualified to teach grades 5 through 9, however middle school teachers must specialize in a subject area (ex: Math, English, Social Studies...). Appropriate MCC electives for this pathway include: EDUC 235; EDUC 285; PSYC 243, or additional credits in the specialty subject area. The MCC EDUC faculty encourage students to pick their university and talk to the College of Education advisors there as soon as possible as they may direct you to even more specific electives to complete at MCC. In order to receive the degree of AAT, students must complete the required courses below, obtain at least state required scores on the MoGEA, and earn a minimum 2.75 GPA.
