### **Philosophy – Full-Time Advising Guide**

Although relatively few people become professional philosophers, the study of philosophy is a vital part of your college education. Philosophy courses have many benefits. You will learn to think deeply, creatively, critically, and communicate competently and thoroughly. All of these will help you in any endeavor, whether it's law, teaching, diplomacy, public service, publishing, journalism, the ministry, the social or natural sciences, mathematics, business, or the arts. Choose from courses that include ethics, logic, world religion, and critical thinking. Our philosophy program is built around the Associate in Arts (AA) degree. This degree gives you a solid two-year background in general education courses that can transfer to a four-year institution.
