## **Associate in Arts (A.A.)**

### **Sociology– Full-Time Advising Guide**

Sociologist's study human behavior, especially the study of the origins, organization, institutions, and development of human society. Social, religious and governmental influences all change that behavior. Our sociology program is built around the Associate in Arts (AA) degree. This degree gives you a solid background in general education courses that can transfer to a four-year institution for a Bachelor's degree. Student pursuing careers in sociology often complete a Master's degree during their educational journey.
