- Some courses are only offered in specific semesters. Students are highly encouraged to create a plan of study with their UCM advisor to ensure they complete all course requirements prior to student teaching.

EDUC 285 is the first course needed for Special Education majors. It is necessary for transfers to take this elective.

Minimum Hours Required for BSE: 120

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REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS MAJOR

- Minimum hours: 120
- Minimum of 30 hours upper level credit (courses numbered 3000 and above). Courses taken at MCC do not count toward the upper-level requirement though they sometimes may be articulated as upper level classes.
- Minimum of 12 upper level credit hours in major

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE AT UCM

- 30 credit hours must be completed at UCM
- 20 upper level hours must be completed at UCM
- 15 credit hours in the major must be from UCM
- 9 upper level hours in the major must be completed at UCM
- The last 12 semester hours must be earned from UCM
- If pursuing a minor, a minimum of 9 hours in the minor must be completed at UCM

TRANSFER WORK

Arrange for all transfer work to be posted at UCM at the time of application. An official transcript must be received at UCM directly from each school attended. Individual transfer equivalencies can be found online at www.ucmo.edu/corequiv.

DUAL ADMISSION

Application for dual admission is strongly recommended to coordinate associate degree completion with degree requirements at UCM. Visit the following website for more information: <http://www.ucmo.edu/undergrad/dualadmissions.cfm>.

ADMISSION TO TEACHER EDUCATION

- Students seeking an initial teaching certificate must gain admission to the Teacher Education program. Specific requirements for Admission to the Teacher Education program are available in the UCM Undergraduate Catalog and at: <http://www.ucmo.edu/cert/admission.cfm>.
- Education students must maintain a 2.75 cumulative GPA and a 3.0 major GPA.
- Students finishing their AAT should plan to complete their DESE Educator Profile and their Fingerprinting/Background Check by the time they start classes at UCM. The background check must be completed through the 3M/Cogent company and posted to the student's DESE profile.
- Special Education students must pass both sections of the Qualifying Exam in order to receive a department recommendation for admission to the teacher education program. For more info, see program coordinator.

GENERAL EDUCATION ASSESSMENT

All UCM students are required to pass a General Education Assessment test. Teacher Education students must pass all sections of the Missouri General Education Assessment (MOGEA) as required by DESE and for Admission to the Teacher Education program. For more information, visit www.mo.nesinc.com.
