

PRACTICAL NURSING REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

The deadline for all the September application period requirements for spring semester is **September 30**.

The deadline for all the March application period requirements for fall semester is **March 31st**.

Note: This includes students with degrees and previous college course work.

The following five (5) items must be completed and satisfied by the deadlines to be considered:

- 1. Apply to MCC. Fill out the general MCC application at www.mcckc.edu/apply-now.
- Submit all non-MCCKC official transcripts. Send official transcripts from all institutions where you have earned college credits to: MCC Student Data Center, 3200 Broadway, Kansas City, MO 64111 OR electronically at transcripts@mcckc.edu.
- 3. Accuplacer, ACT, or SAT score submission. Applicants will either submit current (less than 3 years old) Accuplacer scores, *take the Accuplacer* test or submit ACT/SAT placement score at the time of application completion and submission or have completed the required courses. All required scores must be obtained on either a first or second attempt when taking the test. Failure to meet the required scores on the second attempt in a calendar year will require the student to take the indicated required classes. Students will not be eligible to apply until the required course(s) listed (see table below) have been completed with a grade letter of "C" or higher. If you have completed or tested out of ESL, you are expected to take and complete Read 100 with at least a "C" letter grade or scored 110 on the ESL reading section of ACCUPLACER test (less than three years old). These are the required scores and classes for each section:

- 4. Completion of prerequisite courses with a minimum letter grade of "C" or higher. Note: "C" letter grades or higher is ideal to reach the minimum required 2.0

- 5. Take the ATI TEAS exam. The ATI TEAS exam must be taken by the deadline and a minimum total adjusted score of 58.7% must be obtained on either a first or second attempt in a calendar year (January December).
 Note: Failure to meet the required score on the second attempt will make you ineligible to be considered for the program during the calendar year when you tested. For study materials and register visit www.atitesting.com.

All applicants will be selected based on ranking points. A maximum of eight (8) possible ranking points can be obtained. Here is the example: Prerequisite GPA: Up to a maximum of four (4) points based on prerequisite courses. Biol 150 or HIM 100 Medical Terminology: One (1) point for completed with a grade letter of "C" or higher will be awarded. Note: This course must be six (6) years or less by the deadline and maximum of two attempts in the last six (6) years. CNA Certification or Medical Assistant: One (1) point for applicants who hold a current certification will be awarded. ATI TEAS exam scores: One (1) point for scores in the range from 78% to 90.6%. Two (2) points for scores in the range from 90.7% and higher.

Application Process

To make sure you are ready to apply, please review the **Requirements Evaluation Checklist** located on page #3. The following three (3) steps must be completed (step #3 only if applicable):

- 1. Applicants must submit the online application through the link provided under "Apply" on our Practical Nursing webpage at https://mcckc.edu/programs/practical-nursing
 - **Note:** Part of the online application is to provide three (3) professional references. Each of the references will receive an e-mail with a survey which will need to be filled out and submitted by the reference by the end of the application period.
- 2. Attach your **ATI TEAS** score to the online application before submitting.
 - Note: The attachment must show <u>all</u> attempts.
- 3. Attach your current **CNA or MA Certification** to the online application before submitting it if applicable.
 - **Note:** Expired *Certifications* will not be awarded the extra point.

Admission criteria to the program are reviewed and revised annually and may be subject to change without notice. If changes are made to the admission criteria, the applicant will need to meet all requirements that are in effect at the time of application. Admission to this program is part of a selective admission process and the program reserves the right to admit based upon special circumstances including contingency admission.

Successful completion of the requirements necessary for admission to the program does not guarantee acceptance to the program.

Once accepted into the nursing program, students will attend a mandatory meeting(s) to discuss the following next steps and the required information below:

- Background check. A background check that is returned as flagged will result in immediate grounds for program dismissal.
- Health records
- Certified Profile
- Physical exam
- Immunizations for: chicken pox, measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis, influenza, COVID vaccines, hepatitis B (waiver accepted for Hepatitis B immunization)
- Recent photo on file
- CPR training
- Family Care Safety Registry
- Drug screen to be done at the site required byMCC. A positive screen will result in dismissal from the program. A positive dilute will require a repeat screening for an additional fee.

- Reliable transportation: Assignments to clinical sites are done on a random basis. Many sites are not accessible by public transportation.
 Note: Clinical sites are within the 60-mile radius of MCC-Penn Valley.
- Work schedule that is flexible to accommodate class and clinical requirements. Note: Clinical schedules are not typically available untilclose to the start of the semester.
- MCC requires a plan for payment ofprogram costs on the day of enrollment.

REGISTER ONLINE!

MCC-Penn Valley requires you to take the current version of ATI TEAS test prior to the start of the nursing application period.

- 1) Go to atitesting.com and create an account if you do not already have one.
- 2) Once you've logged in to your account, click on the "online store" option at the very top of the page. To the far left of the next page you will see the following:



3) Scroll to the bottom of the next page and select one of the two options:



Note: MCC-Penn Valley may offer the exam remotely or in person, so please check both options for availability.



- 4) MCC-Penn Valley test days are on Mondays through Fridays
- 5) Payment of \$112 is required upon registration.
- 6) Remote testing (take online)-you must register 48 hours in advance of your desired test date.

In-Person-you must register 24 hours in advance of your desired test date.

Reading	55 minutes	Key ideas and details; craft and structure; and integration of knowledge and ideas –(45 questions)
Mathematics	57 minutes	Numbers, algebra and data interpretation and measurement –(38 questions)
Science	60 minutes	Human anatomy and physiology; life and physical sciences; and scientific reasoning – (50 questions)
English	37 minutes	Conventions of standard English, knowledge of language and vocabulary acquisition – (37 questions)

Total time: 209 minutes = 3hrs 48 min

Your scores will be available immediately after testing, and you may print the scores, if desired. You can also access your scores by logging in to your ATI account @ <u>atitesting.com → My RESULTS tab</u>.
