	Reviving discussions on what student loaner laptop program will look like going forward: Matt Wilkinson	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Quick recap of current loaner laptop situation: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 800 Covid area laptops will be retired from circulation at the end of Spring 2025 semester, as they are too old and underpowered to support Windows 11. Currently, there is no funding in MCC IT budget for purchasing student loaner laptops, funding was asked for FY25 but not provided. IT will ask again in run up to FY26 budget (planning phase). By virtue of grant funds from Kauffman foundation, 200 new Dell laptops went into circulation at the end of 2024 (50 per campus). <i>MCC Student Loaner Laptop Task Force:</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 800 laptops bought at the beginning of pandemic (200 approx. per campus) Preparing to ask for FY26 funding for laptops. The original 800 laptops will be retired at the end of Spring. Popular program and students like having the resource of laptops available to them. 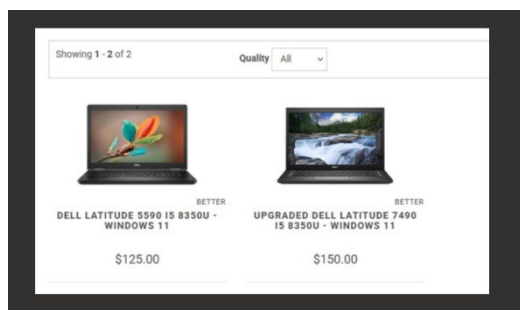

- Strongly consider a wholesale change to how MCC does loaner laptops, such as some kind of means testing, rather than the current first come, first served approach. Also considering a radical idea like partnering with an org like PCs for People (which has a KC location and can also ship) and provides low cost technology to [eligible customers](#).
- MCC could provide some kind of voucher, which the student then provides to PCs for People, and then they acquire a laptop that is THEIRS FOR THE KEEPING – NOT A LOANER. Need to have further discussions with PCs for People to see if they'd even be open to this and could handle the logistics and demand. But the benefit would be students in need would get a robust laptop for no out-of-pocket cost that they keep, and MCC offloads the administrative overhead and work involved with the current loaner program.
