		<p>the end of Spring 2025 semester.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We've had some conversations with PCs for People regarding their low-cost, refurbished laptop program. They have a couple options:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Bridging the Gap Program: We load funds to an account with them, and students can then register individually (they have to meet eligibility requirements).</li><li>○ Bulk Purchase: MCC can do a bulk purchase of refurb laptops, and then distribute them on campus (not unlike the current program)</li></ul></li><li>• "Loan vs Give": The current loaner program has well understood administrative burdens, and we were considering the feasibility of "giving" loaner laptops to students to reduce this burden. However, after discussing this with Dena Norris in Financial Aid, that would be considered a "direct benefit" to students and would just shift the administrative burden.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Financial aid guidelines would need to be applied/accounted for if we moved forward with PCS for People.</li><li>• Conversation continuing with PCS for people.</li><li>• The goal is to get a couple hundred new machines to distribute across the district.</li></ul>	
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	The possibility of Wireless Presentation (screen mirroring) on Smart TVs in meeting rooms: Matt Wilkinson	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>IT did a proof of concept where a Windows 10/11 PCs used Miracast to connect to the in-room Smart TV over the network. It requires both the TV and the laptop to be connected to the MCC Wired or Wireless network. Over the summer, we will be working on getting all Smart TVs in meeting rooms connected to the network, and then naming the TVs to match the building and room #, then generating easy to follow guides to be located in each room</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Offering options for individuals depending on their setting, for wireless presentations.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Miracast (Windows 10 or 11).<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>More groundwork to do, allows for individuals to walk into a room and push the video from their laptop to the screen.</li></ul></li><li>Similarly, there is software that</li></ul></li></ul>	Learning & People

	<p>Working with VoIP provider on using Microsoft Teams as a soft client app (instead of Boomea or Nimbus): Matt Wilkinson</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• working on getting some test licenses, but the hope is that could provide relief with the stability and usability issues with Boomea.
