

## Term Paper Tips

1. GET STARTED NOW!
  2. THINK ABOUT YOUR ASSIGNMENT. What guidelines has your instructor given you?
    - How long does the paper have to be? How many words or pages in length?
    - Do you have to cite a minimum number of sources?
    - Are you required to use books? Scholarly journals? Newspapers?
    - Does the paper have to be argumentative? Should you discuss both sides of an issue?
    - Do you need statistics? An historical overview? Recent information only?
  3. BEFORE YOU GO TO THE LIBRARY – GET ORGANIZED. Make sure you have ...
    - plenty of paper, pens, and pencils.
    - your student I.D. card.
    - a couple of dollars in change or a photocopy card.
    - the term paper assignment sheet, if your instructor handed one out.
  4. TALK TO A LIBRARIAN BEFORE YOU BEGIN YOUR RESEARCH. Librarians are skilled at helping students with research assignments. They can help you ...
    - determine if your topic is too broad or too narrow in scope.
    - decide where to begin looking for information and which subject headings will work best for your topic.
    - determine which library would most likely have the materials you need.
    - figure out how to do footnote and bibliography references.

5. BEFORE YOU HAND IN YOUR PAPER ...
    - proofread your work carefully. It's a good idea to let a friend read your paper. If something you've written doesn't make sense to your friend, it might not make sense to your instructor either.
    - NEVER, NEVER, NEVER hand in a paper without first making a copy!
